Large funding boost helps improve sports facilities

Nearly £145,000 has been awarded to three sports clubs in Lincolnshire to help improve their facilities, thanks to Sport England's Inspired Facilities Fund.

Alford Sports Hall Association, Sleaford Tennis Club and Horncastle Community Members' Squash Club were all successful in securing funding through the fourth round of Sport England's Inspired Facility Fund, which aims to improve sports clubs and facilities up and down the country.

Alford Sports Hall Association was awarded £49,500 from the fund to replace its old and deteriorated sports hall floor. Sleaford Tennis Club was awarded £50,000 to help towards the cost of constructing a pavilion on the same site as its new floodlit courts and Horncastle Community Members' Squash Club was awarded £45,000 to install efficient heating and lighting for its existing premises, as well as refurbish the bar and kitchen area.
